

When I have the "Build" option to my Visual Studio project selected, the service starts right away, as I expected it to. However, if I select the "Publish" option, the service wont start at all. The "run as" option is set to "Local System Account". The "permissions" of the service are set as they should be. The service is not getting started automatically in task scheduler. I have a cmd window open for the service when it is started through build and publish. I can start and stop the service manually from the command prompt (which is confusing, why does the service start/stop automatically?) The service code is compiled through nuget packages.
